OVERVIEW

The Miss Jamaica Festival Queen Competition, formerly known as the Miss Jamaica Beauty Contest, began in 1965. The Contest has developed over the years to become the premier forum for culturally aware, intelligent and poised young ladies seeking an opportunity to contribute to the development of their community and country. The contestants are judged in the categories of Cultural Awareness, Community Involvement, Talent Presentation and Most Poised categories.

Under the direction of the Ministry of Culture, Gender, Entertainment and Sport, the programme is a project executed by the Jamaica Cultural Development Commission (JCDC), and seeks to encourage young Jamaican women from the ages of eighteen to thirty (18 – 30) years, to participate in and be identified with their culture and community activities at the parish and national levels. The programme is hosted by the Patron of the Competition, His Worship the Mayor, Councillor Norman Scott and provides training in personal development, showcases talents of the contestants and develops their leadership qualities. The pageant is a family oriented event and attracts and maintains a large number of educated, talented and culturally aware young ladies vying to become Miss Jamaica Festival Queen each year.

As a part of training and development for the contestants within the parish, a schedule is developed to include courtesy calls to the Custos and Mayors, historic tours, etiquette training sessions, walk and poise, questions and answers, current affairs, etc.

Generally, the competition focuses on cultural awareness, community involvement, general knowledge, creative talent through the Performing Arts, personal achievements as well as the role of women both locally and internationally.

Each year, the Jamaica Cultural Development Commission (JCDC) conducts a training programme for the contestants. The training session is conducted in each parish and covers the areas that will be judged in the competition as well as topics that will be useful to the contestants.

The training sessions usually cover the areas that are being judged in the competition.

For the Most Popular on Social Media, the contestants will be posted on social media for the most votes.

To date, three Queens from St Catherine were honored to have captured the Miss Jamaica Festival Queen title. In 1990 - Dahlia Harris, 2019 - Khamara Wright and 2023 - Aundrene Cameron. The (2024) Miss St Catherine Festival Queen is Shahidah Grant who hails from the Linstead area.

For 2025 Eleven (11) finalists will vie for the coveted title of the Miss St Catherine Festival Queen Finals scheduled for Sunday, June 22 at 7:00 p.m. at the Eltham High School, Brunswick Street, Spanish Town, St Catherine.
